Dear Ms. Halsey:

The Department of Finance has reviewed the issue of consolidating the Peace Officers Procedural Bill of Rights (POBOR) mandate programs, POBOR (CSM 4499) and POBOR II (03-TC-18). We support consolidating the programs within a parameters and guidelines document to alleviate any confusion in the reimbursement claiming process. We, however, recommend that both programs have separate sections unique to their program's claiming requirements in the parameters and guidelines. While the programs are similar in that they have some approved activities in the same statutory code section, they are different with respect to their claiming periods, potential claiming reimbursement options, and specific activities.

Pursuant to section 1181.2, subdivision (c)(1)(E) of the California Code of Regulations, "documents that are e-filed with the Commission on State Mandates need not be otherwise served on persons that have provided an e-mail address for the mailing list."
