Dear Ms. Chinn:

On September 24, 2020, the City of San Marcos (claimant) filed a request with the Commission on State Mandates (Commission) for an extension of time to file comments on the Draft Proposed Decision on the above-captioned Incorrect Reduction Claim (IRC), currently due September 25, 2020, in addition to a postponement of hearing, currently scheduled for December 4, 2020.

Specifically, the claimant requests a one or preferably two-month extension of time and a postponement of hearing to the next regularly scheduled meeting<sup>1</sup> to review and respond to the Draft Proposed Decision because staffing has been adversely affected due to the response to the COVID-19 situation and other ongoing projects. In addition, the claimant states that since the time period of this claim dates back to FY 2001-2002, gathering the detailed contact information that is necessary to show evidence as Commission staff analysis suggests is lacking, is extremely time consuming and difficult to obtain on the deadlines originally established.

Section 1187.9(a) of the Commission's regulations provide that a party to a matter may request an extension of time by filing a request with the executive director before the date set for filing of comments or rebuttals with Commission staff on that matter. The request shall fully explain the reasons for the extension, propose a new date for filing, and be certified, filed, and served in accordance with section 1181.3 of these regulations. If representations of fact are made, they shall be supported by documentary or testimonial evidence in accordance with section 1187.5 of

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these regulations. A request that would necessitate rescheduling a hearing shall also include a request for postponement of the hearing, pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section.

Section 1187.9(b) of the Commission's regulations provide that while postponements are disfavored and pursuant to Government Code section 17530, the executive director has a duty to expedite all matters before the Commission, a request for postponement filed by the claimant at least 15 days before the hearing shall be approved for good cause. (Cal. Code. Regs., tit. 2 § 1187.9(b).)

Due to the extraordinary working conditions resulting from COVID-19 protocols and the claimant's excused inability to obtain essential testimony, documents, or other material evidence despite diligent efforts, Commission staff finds that this request is supported by good cause. Therefore, the request for extension of time to file comments on the Draft Proposed Decision, and for postponement of hearing is approved pursuant to section 1187.9(a) and (b)(1)(D) and (b)(3)(A) of the Commission's regulations. The claimant's comments are now due **November 20, 2020**. This matter is now set for hearing on **January 22, 2021**.
