## II. 2013-14 BUDGET

On January 10, 2013 the Governor released the proposed state budget. It includes \$1,873<sup>6</sup> to fund the Commission. This includes a budget change proposal for the addition of \$245 in order to hire a Staff Counsel III and a Senior Legal Analyst. The additional staffing will enable the Commission to better comply with statutory time frames and to accelerate the reduction of the test claim, parameters and guidelines (Ps&Gs), parameter and guideline amendment (PGA), statewide cost estimate (SCE), and incorrect reduction claim (IRC) backlogs. These efficiencies are “cost cutting” in that they result in a significant statewide savings of future costs and liabilities in the millions of dollars. They will also enable the Administration and the Legislature to have appropriately timed policy discussions on the merits of various mandates.

### Mandate Funding

The Administration proposes the following changes in the 2013-14 budget:

#### A. Education

- An increase of \$100 million to the K-12 portion of the mandates block grant to support costs associated with the Graduation Requirements and Behavioral Intervention Plans mandates.

- The Administration proposes to restructure requirements for the Behavioral Intervention Plan program, which will eliminate almost all reimbursable costs for this mandate. There are no changes proposed for the Graduation Requirements program, and the Administration continues to believe that any costs associated with this activity have run their course in the almost 30 years since the inception of this requirement.
