### EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

#### Budget, Workload Update, and Tentative Agenda Items for the May and July 2017 Meetings (info)

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##### I. 2017-18 Budget

The Commission's budget is set for hearing in Senate Budget Subcommittee 4 on March 30, 2017 and in Assembly Budget Subcommittee 4 on April 18, 2017.

##### A. The Commission's Operating Budget: 8885-001-0001

The Commission's budget as proposed in the Governor's Budget is \$2,192,000, which is slightly higher than the current year to account for general salary increases approved by the Legislature and unavoidable increases in operating costs.

##### B. Local Agency Mandate Funding and Suspension

##### i. Under the Commission's Budget: 8885-295-0001—For Local Assistance for Reimbursement

**ii. 5180-151-0001—For Local Assistance, Department of Social Services**

Although local agency mandates have generally been funded through the Commission’s budget in recent years, this budget makes 4 million dollars available in county-optional block grant funding through the Department of Social Services’ budget, for allocation to local agencies to fund activities that are reimbursable under *Interagency Child Abuse and Neglect Investigation Reports*, 00-TC-22. Local governments that receive the block grant funding are not eligible to claim costs under section 17560 of the Government Code for any costs associated with the program. The Department of Social Services, in consultation with the California State Association of Counties, shall develop the allocation methodology for distributing the funds to the participating counties.

**C. K-14 Mandate Funding and Suspension**

Unlike local agency mandate funding, K-14 mandate funding takes place outside of the Commission’s budget. Among other things, the Budget Bill (AB 96, Ting) does the following with regard to mandate funding:

- Appropriates \$226.5 million for the K-12 Mandated Programs Block Grant, \$29.87 per unit of average daily attendance of pupils in kindergarten to grade 8, inclusive, and \$57.36 per unit of average daily attendance of pupils in grades 9 to 12, inclusive.
