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<sup>1</sup> By statute, the SCO has up to 90 days to issue the claiming instructions and claimants have 120 days from that date to file claims. The SCO generally provides the claiming data to the Commission approximately 30 days after the deadline to file claims. In the case of programs that have ended, no claiming instructions are issued and no further claims can be filed.

<sup>2</sup> Please note that tentative hearing dates are an estimate of when Commission staff expects the matter will be set for hearing based on currently available information regarding workload and staffing. A matter is not actually set for hearing until the draft proposed decision is issued and tentative hearing dates often change.
