The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict-of-interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories shall constitute the conflict-of-interest code of the Commission on State Mandates (Commission).	
18 19 20 21 22 23	Individuals holding designated positions shall file their statements of economic interests with the Commission, which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction. (Gov. Code, § 81008.) Upon receipt of the statements for the Commission members, their alternates, and the Executive Director, the Commission shall make and retain a copy and forward the originals to the Fair Political Practices Commission. All other statements will be retained by the Commission.

24 25 26 27 28 29 30	The executive director may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The executive director's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict-of-interest code. (Gov. Code § 81008.)

32 33 34	Elected state officers (State Treasurer and State Controller), and the Director of Finance who serve on the Commission on State Mandates are not required to file a statement of economic interests under this conflict-of-interest code. Elected state officers are excepted from filing under

36 37	California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730(b)(3). However, all other members and all designees must file a statement of economic interests under this conflict-of-interest code with
