

We need to review this material to determine what the status of the case is. Often victims do not know if a case is closed or has been rejected. Additionally we do not have any way to confirm if the report is authentic or has been altered with reviewing our files.

DECLARATION OF MICHAEL CISZEK


I, Michael Ciszek, make the following declaration under oath and under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the following statements are true and correct of my own personal knowledge:

1. I am a Lieutenant for the City of Claremont. I have been employed by the City in this capacity since 2009 and have been a law enforcement officer since 1996. As part of my duties, I am, and have been directly involved and have personal knowledge of the UVISA program, process, and activities performed by the City of Claremont which were required by Penal Code 679.10, added by Senate Bill 674, Statutes of 2015 (referred to as the UVISA program).
2. In reviewing the UVISA applications, most of the forms did not have the original report. I was required to locate and review the associated crime report and verify the victim's cooperativeness at the time the initial report was taken.
3. I was required to verify the original crime report occurred within my jurisdiction and that the victim was in fact the same person requesting the UVISA application. My signature on the application certified that the facts were true and correct, to the best of my knowledge, under penalty of perjury.
4. Victims that had obtained a copy of their crime reports were only given 1.) Names and addresses of involved persons and witnesses; 2.) Description of property involved; 3.) Date, time and location of incident; 4.) Diagrams; 5.) Statements of involved parties; 6.) Statements of witness, as per Government Code 6254(f). Victims do not receive analysis or conclusions of the investigating officer. This information was often critical in making the determination to sign and approve the application.
5. I would contact the district attorney's office to obtain case status regarding the applicant's case and verify that the victim continued to cooperate with the District Attorney's office throughout the legal process.
6. I reviewed audio and video evidence associated to the event to determine the victim's initial helpfulness when they reported the crime.

I am personally conversant with the foregoing facts and information presented in declaration and in this Test Claim and if so required, I could and would testify to the statements made herein.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct based upon my own personal knowledge.


