Extension of Time and Postponement of Hearing

On December 20, 2016, the Commission on State Mandates (Commission) received a request from the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (Regional Board), for a 90-day extension of time to file a response to the Request for Additional Evidence and Briefing issued on December 2, 2016 for the above-captioned permit and for postponement of the May 26, 2017 hearing on the above-named matter to the next regularly scheduled meeting.

Section 1187.9(a) and (b) of the Commission's regulations provide that each request for extension and for postponement shall fully explain the reasons for the request and authorize the executive director to grant a postponement of hearing upon an affirmative showing of good cause.

Because an extension of more than 60-days would require a postponement from the May to the September hearing, your request for an extension of time is approved for 60-days for good cause and the hearing is postponed to the July, 2017 meeting of the Commission pursuant to Government Code section 17553(a)(3) and section 1187.9(a) and (b) of the Commission's regulations.

A Test Claim Functions Similarly to a Class Action

A "test claim" is the first claim filed with the Commission alleging that a particular legislative enactment or executive order imposes costs mandated by the state. (Gov. Code § 17521.) Though multiple claimants may join together in pursuing a joint test claim, the Commission will not hear duplicate claims, and Commission decisions *apply statewide* to similarly situated school districts and local agencies (or in the case of a stormwater permit, to all entities under the permit).¹ Thus, the test claim "functions similarly to a class action and has been established to

expeditiously resolve disputes affecting multiple agencies.”² Besides the claimants, other similarly situated local agencies may, but need not, participate in the test claim process as interested parties. In most test claims filed with the Commission, there is only one claimant (in some cases there are two or three joint claimants who must allege state-mandated costs from the same statute or executive order, agree on all issues of the test claim, and select a joint representative) although the class of eligible claimants to claim reimbursement if the test claim is successful can be in the hundreds (for cities and counties), or even more than one thousand (for school districts).

For example, you may be familiar with the Test Claim on Los Angeles Regional Quality Control Board Order No. 01-182. In that claim, the cities of Artesia, Beverly Hills, Carson, Norwalk, Rancho Palos Verdes, Westlake Village, Azusa, Commerce, Vernon, Bellflower, Covina, Downey, Monterey Park, and Signal Hill, were the claimants. However, under the Parameters and Guidelines adopted for that approved Test Claim, any of the 84 co-permittees that were not subject to a TMDL were listed as eligible to submit reimbursement claims for placing trash receptacles at transit stops— not just the 14 joint claimants. Similarly here, if activities are approved for reimbursement in these consolidated test claims, all of the co-permittees subject to the approved activities will be eligible to claim reimbursement for their increased costs mandated by the state without regard to their participation in the Test Claim.

As stated in the Request for Additional Briefing and Evidence, prior Commission staff determined that it would be allowable to have one test claim per county area due to the different prior permits that will require analysis to determine whether and when an activity required by the test claim permit imposes a new program or higher level of service and, in one case, due to the fact that that was the only claim to plead the municipal operations activities. And those same Commission staff received and returned numerous test claim duplicate filings on *Order No. R2-2009-0074* from other co-permittees who were not the first to file from their county area, because a test claim “is the first claim filed with the Commission alleging that a particular legislative enactment or executive order imposes costs mandated by the state.”³ Arguably only two test claims should have been allowed to be filed at that time (Brisbane and San Jose since they were the first claims alleging different provisions of law impose a state-mandated new program of higher level of service). However these claims were permitted to be filed many years ago, are now consolidated for hearing, and there is no prejudice to any of the parties as a result of allowing them to go forward, though it does significantly increase workload for Commission staff. However, there is absolute no need as a practical matter and no requirement in law for the other co-permittees to file individual test claims on Order No. R2-2009-0074. To the contrary, any such claims will be returned as duplicative. That said, any interested party (which includes all co-permittees) is welcome to (but need not) participate in the test claim process and may submit any comments or evidence that they wish to have considered during the comment periods.

Co-Permittee Urban Runoff Management Plans and Subsequent Annual Work Plans

The Regional Board takes the position that the Commission, by making its request for additional documentation, “shifts the burden of submitting claims from the test claimant to the Regional Water Board. . . .” Commission staff disagrees.

In a test claim, a claimant always bears the ultimate burden of persuasion, but the burden of producing evidence can, in different situations, fall on the claimant or on another party. As explained by the Second District Court of Appeal:

The terms burden of proof and burden of persuasion are synonymous. . . . [¶]
“Except as otherwise provided by law, a party has the burden of proof as to each fact the existence or nonexistence of which is essential to the claim for relief or defense that he is asserting.” (Evid.Code, § 500.) To prevail, the party bearing the burden of proof on the issue must present evidence sufficient to establish in the mind of the trier of fact or the court a requisite degree of belief (commonly proof by a preponderance of the evidence). (Evid.Code, §§ 115, 520.) The burden of proof does not shift during trial — it remains with the party who originally bears it. (Evid.Code, § 500; [Citations].)
Unlike the burden of proof, the burden of producing evidence may shift between plaintiff and defendant throughout the trial. (See Evid.Code, § 550; [Citations].) Initially, the burden of producing evidence as to a particular fact rests on the party with the burden of proof as to that fact. (Evid.Code, § 550, subd. (b); [Citation].) [O]nce that party produces evidence sufficient to make its prima facie case, the burden of producing evidence shifts to the other party to refute the prima facie case. (See Evid.Code, § 550; [Citations].) Even though the burden of producing evidence shifts to the other party, that party need not offer evidence in reply, but failure to do so risks an adverse verdict. (Ibid.) Once a prima facie showing is made, it is for the trier of fact to say whether or not the crucial and necessary facts have been established. (Ibid.)⁴

In 10-TC-05, the claimant City of San Jose appears to have met its initial burden of producing evidence that certain municipal discharge requirements in the 2009 Permit are new, i.e., *were not* previously imposed upon the municipality co-permittees by the prior permit. In comments on the Test Claim, the Regional Board argues that many of the requirements of the 2009 Permit that are alleged to be new are in fact old, because they were previously imposed upon the claimant by the City’s Urban Runoff Management Plan and subsequent annual Work Plans, which the Regional Board asserts constitute prior state law.⁵ This is an issue of first impression; it has never been argued before in a mandate claim that a city’s Urban Runoff Management Plan and subsequent annual Work Plans constitute prior state law (though such plans are generally required of municipal dischargers statewide) and the claimant has rebutted this assertion arguing that it had discretion to change the activities in the plan prior to the adoption of the 2009 permit.

Since the Regional Board is arguing that the City's Urban Runoff Management Plan and subsequent annual Work Plans constitute prior state law, and since, as discussed above, this Test Claim applies to all co-permittee municipalities, the Regional Board bears the burden of producing such evidence for all covered municipalities, to the extent it is also arguing that certain requirements imposed by the 2009 permit on those co-permittees, although not appearing in the 2002 permit, are not new.

To be valid, a water quality control plan or revision thereto must be approved by the relevant Regional Board and the State Board.⁶ In *San Francisco Baykeeper*, the California Superior Court ruled, "Because the Storm Water Management Plan is incorporated and is deemed an integral part of the Permits...any changes to the Plan are actually changes to the Permits. Because these are changes to the Permits, the notice and comment requirements must be complied with."⁷ Therefore, as a practical matter, the Regional Board should have all of these documents in its possession (or be aware of where such documents are located) because both the Regional Board and State Board would have reviewed and approved these documents in public meetings of the boards for them to have amended the permit.⁸

Pursuant to the ruling in *San Francisco Baykeeper*,⁹ the provisions in the discharge permits by which water quality plans or amendments are deemed approved or disapproved by the action or inaction of the Regional Board's Executive Officer are void. The Superior Court ruled, among other things, that the approval authority of the Regional Board is non-delegable.¹⁰ Therefore, the Commission would need evidence in the record that the water quality control plans and any alleged revisions thereto were in fact adopted by the Regional Board and the State Board. Such evidence may include adopted decisions or orders of the boards, and excerpts of official minutes and transcripts of the Regional Board and State Board meetings when the boards adopted the water quality control plans and revisions thereto.

Consequently, to meet its burden of production, the Regional Board or the State Board would need to provide to the Commission copies of the Urban Runoff Management Plans and the subsequent annual Work Plans for each municipality co-permittee and evidence of adoption of those plans by the regional and state boards to show that the requirements contain therein are in fact incorporated into the 2002 permits.



The Regional Board and the State Board may decline to provide the requested documents. But, as noted above by the Second District, "failure to do so risks an adverse verdict." As long as the Regional Board contends that the 2009 Permit did not impose new requirements on municipalities, despite apparent changes between the 2002 and 2009 permits, the Regional Board bears the burden of producing the evidence that those changes are not new and the burden of producing evidence that all plans and amendments were validly adopted by the Regional Board and the State Board.

If the boards choose to respond, the response is now due **February 21, 2017**. Any request for additional extensions of time will also require a request for postponement and an affirmative showing of good cause.

This matter is now set for hearing at the next regularly scheduled hearing on **July 28, 2017**, at 10:00 a.m. in Room 447 of the State Capitol, Sacramento, California.


