Dear Ms. Halsey:

Our firm represents several of the test claimants in this matter, including Clovis Unified School District, Fullerton Joint Union High School District, Grossmont Union High School District, Norwalk-La Mirada USD, Poway Unified School District, and Sweetwater Union High School District.

In addition, we are also representing the California School Boards Association ("CSBA") with regard to this matter.

Friday, February 28, 2020, we were first made aware that the Commission issued, on December 20, 2019, a "Request for Simultaneous Comment on the Request to Amend Parameters and Guidelines for the Graduation Requirements program and the Application of the Court's Opinion in *California School Boards Association (CSBA) v. State of California* ("Commission Request for Comments"). The Commission Request for Comments initially called for comments by all interested parties no later than January 20, 2020.

Subsequent to the Commission Request for Comments, the Department of Finance ("Finance"), on January 17, 2020 and February 18, 2020, requested a 30-day and a 60-day extension to file comments and postpone the hearing ("Finance Extension Requests"). On January 17, 2020 and February 20, 2020, the Commission granted extensions of time to file comments ("Commission Extension"), with the comment filing period ultimately extended to April 20, 2020. However, the Commission Extension

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appears to apply *only* to Finance. We confirmed this by phone call to the Commission on March 2, 2020.

The Finance proposed amendments to Parameters & Guidelines for the graduation requirements program had been placed on inactive status at the request of the above claimants (see Kronick letter dated September 26, 2011) since about June 2012. The attorney of record (previously, Diana Halpenny of Kronick Moskovitz Tiedemann & Girard) was not updated on the Commission's mailing list to reflect the current attorneys of record, Christian M. Keiner (the undersigned) and William B. Tunick, both attorneys of the firm Dannis Woliver Kelly. Our firm, thus, did not receive notice of the Commission Request for Comments, nor did it receive the subsequent notices of Finance Extension Requests and Commission Extension. We have subsequently updated the Commission's mailing list in this regard.

In any event, we agree with Finance's position that an extension of time to file comments on the Commission Request is appropriate here, where the resolution of remaining issues in *California School Boards Association (CSBA) v. State of California* were remanded by the Supreme Court and are still pending in the lower court.

Most importantly, comments by affected test claimants will assist the Commission and provide a full record. Additionally, comments by CSBA will be helpful to the Commission and the record. Accordingly, we respectfully petition for leave to file comments and request the same extension to file such comments pursuant to the Request for Simultaneous Comment on the Request to Amend Parameters and Guidelines for the Graduation Requirements program and the Application of the Court's Opinion in *CSBA v. State of California*. In short, we can meet the April 20, 2020 deadline for comments. Thus, this petition/request will not impact the comment or hearing timelines. We respectfully assert the "good cause" standard has been met here.
