DOUGHERTY: Item 2 is a test claim alleging 13 new state-mandated activities and costs resulting from 14 Elections Code Section 9051, as amended in 2022. 15 relevant amendment to Elections Code Section 9051 was 16 part of an act named the Ballot DISCLOSE Act. The intent 17 of the Ballot DISCLOSE Act was to give voters more 18 information when casting their ballots. This test claim 19 concerns only statewide measures and the ballot labels 20 for those measures. 21 The new Elections Code section has lengthened what 22 is known as the Ballot Label. The Ballot Label is the 23 text that appears on a voter's ballot itself. Formerly, 24 the Ballot Label was simply the attorney general's

condensed title and summary which is limited to 75 words.

25

The new Elections Code section required that two lists be added to the Ballot Label for statewide measures. list is for supporters, and one is for opponents. lists first appeared on the March 2024 ballot. Each list is limited to 125 characters in length, and it comes from the signers or text of the arguments in favor and in opposition to the measure. The supporters and opponents of a measure submit these lists to the Secretary of State for review. The Secretary of State will then confirm that the lists comply with various legal requirements and add them after the Attorney General's condensed title and summary. Together, the title and summary, plus these new lists, constitute the new Ballot Label. The Secretary of State, after certifying the Ballot Label, provides it to county elections officials for printing on the voters' be ballots.

As the claimant has demonstrated here, the additional text extends each voter's printed ballot, incurring the expense of printing additional ballot cards. Commission staff finds the test claim statue imposes a reimbursable state-mandated program within the meaning of Article XIII B, Section 6 of the California Constitution and Government Code Section 17514 and recommends the Commission approve this test claim and authorize staff to make any technical nonsubstantive

      adjustment that results from an audit or review and now

      requires the controller to allow a local agency or school

district, at the sole discretion of the local agency or school district, to offset any reduced reimbursement as prescribed or to remit funds to the controller.

There has been no new action on this bill.

Next, AB 1452, State Mandates, Claims. AB 1452 was introduced by Assembly Member Ta. This bill amends Government Code Section 17564. This bill would change the minimum claim amount that requires the state to reimburse a local government from \$1,000 to \$800.

There has been no new action on this bill.

Next, SB 470, Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act,
Teleconferencing. SB 470 was introduced by Senator
Laird. This bill now amends Government Code Sections
11123.2 and 11123.5. The act authorizes an additional
alternative set of provisions under which a state body
may hold a meeting by teleconference subject to specified
requirements. Existing law repeals these provisions on
January 1st, 2026. This bill now repeals these revisions
on January 1st, 2030. On July 10th, 2025, this bill
passed and was re-referred to the Assembly Committee on
Appropriations.

Finally, AB 395, Holidays. AB 395 was introduced by Assembly Member Gabrielle. This bill amends

Government Code Section 11131, the Bagley-Keene Open

Meeting Act. Among other things, this bill would require

that a state agency shall make every reasonable effort to avoid conducting any meeting, conference, or other function on a date for which the state agency knows or has reason to know that members of the public would be unable to participate or be present due to the ritual observance of a religious, cultural, or ancestral holiday, including, but not limited to, Eid al-Adha, Eid al-Fitr, Feast of the Nativity, Maha Shivaratri, the first and last two days of Pesach, also known as Passover, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Dawali and Dussehra.

On July 7th, 2025, the hearing on this bill by the Senate Committee on Judiciary was postponed, and on July 14th, 2025, this bill was set for first hearing but was cancelled at the request of the author. Staff will continue to monitor legislation for bills that impact the Mandate's process.
